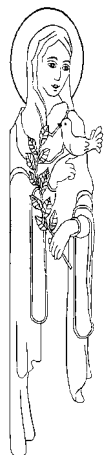

† POLICIES †

Safe Environment Program Background Checks

The Archdiocese of Seattle has a longstanding commitment to the protection of children, youth, and vulnerable adults. This is accomplished through the Safe Environment and Background Check programs.

All church personnel, including priests, deacons, seminarians, religious men and women, lay staff, and volunteers who have ongoing unsupervised contact with minors or vulnerable adults, are required to complete *Called to Protect for Ministries* workshop. Everyone is encouraged to familiarize themselves with the Safe Environment Program and related policies, which are available on the Catholic Archdiocese of Seattle web site, www.seattlearch.org under the Safe Environment tab.

All clergy, staff, and members that continue in ministries to our young and vulnerable population must annually complete an on-line Safe Environment training course on keeping this population safe.

Background checks are completed every three years on all parish staff and volunteers who are involved in any of the following ministries: adults involved in youth and children programs, Eucharistic ministers who visit the homebound, money counters, ushers in sole control of the offertory collection, and adult volunteers working in fundraising activities.

Parish Facility Users

All users of the parish facility are expected to be good stewards of our parish facility and are asked to clean up after themselves, empty trash, put away tables and chairs, turn off lights, and close all windows and doors.

Facility Usage for Non-Parish Events

Although Mary, Queen of Peace's facility is primarily reserved for the liturgical, sacramental, educational, and ministry programs, we offer the usage of our facility to non-profit groups and to individuals for private events. The facility is never available to "for-profit" businesses, political parties, or candidates for office.

To reserve a room you must complete and submit a Facility Rental/Usage Agreement, which can be found on the parish website (www.mqp.org), and either provide a \$1 million liability insurance certificate (with the parish and archdiocese named as additional insured) or purchase special event insurance provided by Catholic Mutual through the parish office.

Open dates for the use of facilities can be obtained by contacting the parish office at 425.391.1178, ext. 113 or e-mail office@mqp.org. Events must conclude by 10:00 pm.

† SACRAMENTS †

Baptism Preparation for Parents of Young Children

If you would like to have your child baptized, **please contact Zoltan Abraham at 425.391.1178, ext. 117 or adulded@mqp.org.**

The baptism preparation process has four steps:

- **Schedule an interview** with Zoltan Abraham.
- **Attend our Baptism Class, which is held once a month.** Please check the baptism section of our parish website www.mqp.org for information about the date, time, and place of each class.
- **Turn in necessary documents:** 1) Baptism Interview Intake Form, 2) Baptism Information Sheet, 3) a photocopy of the child's birth certificate, and, 4) if both of the godparents are from outside of the parish, a letter of reference from the home parish of at least one of the godparents is required.
- **Schedule date of baptism:** Baptisms are celebrated on a monthly basis, during the 5:00pm Vigil Mass, and the 9:00am, 11:30am and 5:30pm Sunday Masses. The date of baptism will be scheduled after the completion of the interview and Baptism Class.

Baptism Preparation Team Member help prepare parents of young children for the sacrament of Baptism. We are looking for teachers for our monthly Baptism Classes.

Children's Reconciliation is a sacrament of love, forgiveness, and growth. Parents will partner with the parish for two month Immediate Preparation process for Sacrament of Reconciliation. There is no "automatic" age or grade level for the reception of this sacrament.

Criteria for Reconciliation preparation are:

- The child must be in 2nd grade or higher, be baptized in the Catholic Church, and exhibits a readiness to be prepared for Reconciliation.
- In addition to Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLW), the child should have been enrolled in at least one of the following Faith Formation programs the school year before Reconciliation preparation begins: Weekly Faith Formation class, Home Study, or Catholic School. The child should also be in a Faith Formation program the year he or she will prepare for the Sacrament.
- Parents are asked to be active participants in preparing their child by informing themselves through parent classes, then working with the child at home.

Preparation for First Reconciliation takes place in the winter. Registration information will be sent via mail, e-mail, and the Sunday bulletin.

The Sacrament of First Reconciliation will be celebrated during Lent.

† SACRAMENTS †

First Eucharist is an event of great joy for families and for the whole Christian community. Like First Reconciliation, there is no “automatic” age or grade level for reception of this sacrament.

Criteria for First Eucharist preparation are:

- The child must be in 2nd grade or older and be Baptized in the Catholic Church.
- In addition to Children’s Liturgy of the Word, the child should have participated in at least one of the following programs: (Home Study, Weekly Faith Formation, or Catholic School) the school year before Eucharistic preparation begins. The child should also be in a Faith Formation program the year he or she will prepare for the Sacrament.
- The child has prepared for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- Parents are asked to be active participants in preparing their child by informing themselves through parent classes, then working with the child at home.
- The child should exhibit a desire and readiness to be prepared for First Eucharist.

Preparation takes place in the spring. Registration for Sacramental preparation is sent via US mail, or e-mail in advance of the beginning of classes to those in our database who have prepared for First Reconciliation and have completed the requisite proximate formation.

The Sacrament of First Eucharist will be celebrated on May 15th at 5pm & May 16th at 9, 11:30 & 5:30 pm. Mass assignments will be given at the time of registration. Travel plans made in advance should accommodate all four Mass times.

Teen Confirmation

Confirmation is one of the three Sacraments of Christian Initiation, along with Baptism and Eucharist. Confirmation involves the "sealing" and strengthening of the Holy Spirit, whose gifts make us more like Christ.

In the Archdiocese of Seattle, those baptized in infancy **must be at least 16 years of age by the date of Confirmation to be confirmed.**

Proximate preparation for Confirmation begins in the middle-school and early high-school years through participation in parish youth programs, such as The Edge and Life Teen. Preparation for Confirmation begins in the fall and continues through the liturgical year, with the Rite of Confirmation celebrated the following fall. In addition to Confirmation classes and Life Teen activities, the preparation process includes retreats and service opportunities.

Confirmation Catechists help prepare senior high youth for Confirmation. Team members are responsible for facilitating small group gatherings, attending the Confirmation Retreat, and working with the Confirmation service projects. Training is provided.

Take advantage of our brief, but comprehensive, Adult Confirmation Program, offered in the Winter of 2010. LITURGY

Liturgy Commission helps to foster the life and mission of the parish through the celebration of the liturgy. This commission assists with the planning, preparation, and evaluation of the various rites of the Roman Catholic liturgy, according to the norms and principles articulated in the Church's liturgical documents. The liturgy commission is made up of the pastor, representatives of the various liturgical ministries of the parish, and members of the parish at large. The commission normally meets the third Wednesday of the month. (no meeting July and August)

The children's Catechumenate is designed for children of Catechetical age (7+) who have not been Baptized or who have been Baptized in another Christian denomination and wish to enter the Catholic Church. It is a process that can be anywhere from one to two years in duration and culminates at the Easter Vigil Mass in full initiation with the celebration of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

At-Home Religious Education

The MQP Home Study program offers flexibility for busy family schedules. Families may join or cluster in homes with other families to share stories and learn about their faith. In order to accommodate busy schedules, families will coordinate their own meeting schedules. Pastoral Council is a consultative body to the pastor. The purpose of the pastoral council is to examine, consider, and draw conclusions concerning matters under discussion in order to recommend a course of action to the pastor. Through pastoral planning, the pastoral council assists the pastor in developing and living out the mission of the parish; forming community as a sign and witness of unity for the larger parish community; providing recommendations for parish priorities, directions, and policies through pastoral planning; and promoting communication and understanding among parish organizations and between the parish, the Archdiocese, and the universal Church.

The primary value for selecting membership of a parish pastoral council is that the council should be a true reflection of the parish community. Members should be inclusive of the demographic realities of the community. Members do not represent a particular constituency but should reflect the diversity of the parish in terms such as age, race, and length of membership in the parish. Members of the pastoral council must be baptized and confirmed Roman Catholics in good standing with the Church. Meetings are held the first Wednesday of each month (except August) at 7pm.
